


Switching from a Dose and Post Service to emailing PDF

How our service works











Postal Costs of Dose and Post Service

- Each 1st Class letter is 57p
- Daily cost of post £390
- Weekly cost £1,700
- Yearly cost £87,500









What we needed to do.

- Approach 4s, GP liaison, SaTH IT, Pathology Business Manager
- Devise test email to check for integrity of delivery
- Devise dose letter PDF for emailing
- Keep record of who we invited into pilot
- Up date patient's email address
- Send test email to patient
- Await patient response
- Switch to email PDF as preferred contact method
- Send blood test forms to patient for future INR's

INVITATION

We are looking to be able to offer the option to email INR results, anticoagulant (e.g. warfarin, sinthrome or phenindione) dosage advice and next INR test date to our patients.

- Patients will receive their results directly via email.
- Results will reach people for quicker than using 1st class mail. This means dose changes can take place earlier
- . This will also lead to significant cost savings for the NHS

Please note that any urgent dose changes will continue to be telephoned to you as per standard procedure. An email will then also be sent to confirm that advice.

If you do not have a personal amail address, but have a relative or carer who does, provided that you are happy for them to receive results on your behalf, and have signed below, we can use their

We are now inviting you to inform us if you have an email address to which we can send your results and dosage advice.

By opting to receive results and dose advice by email, you will no longer receive a paper copy by mail. You will be sent some blood test request forms for use when having an INR blood test. These will have the same questions for you to complete as on your current form.

You may need to mark our incoming email sender address att-triverfarin@r/hs.net as an acceptable

Please note that this address will be used for outgoing emails only (i.e. from the hospital to you), with the exception of confirmation of receipt of test email. You should not use this email address to

If you would like to receive your INR results, anticoagulant dosage advice and the date of your next INR test by email please complete the attached form. Once completed the form should be attached to your normal warfarin alip and handed in at your next visit to have blood taken.

Once we receive your completed form we will add the email address to your record. We will then send you a test email to check the email address and link, you will be asked to reply to that email and as soon as we receive your response, we will activate the email link for future results. At this point we will send you a supply of blood test forms.

The Plan!

- The surgery phlebotomist would hand out invitation
- Patient returns consent form
- Update Dawn with email address
- Send test email to patient
- Patient acknowledges receipt of test email
- Switch patient to email dosing












Up and Running!











NHS Cyber Attack.



- Plan for the Unexpected
- Have a Plan B
- Have the ability to switch back to postal dosing









Benefits from making the switch to emailing dosing from dose and post service.

- Timely delivery of results, patients no longer waiting up to 4 days for delivery of dose card
- Less phone calls into office asking for dose advice as card not arrived back
- Savings in postal budget









Additional Benefits

Assuming average of 12 tests per year, per patient

30 % up take of patients switching to email dosing, Anticipated saving per year £15,500

40% up take of patients switching to email dosing, anticipated saving per year £20,520

From our current £87,500 postal costs









Another possible saving?

We are currently piloting a trial of sending mail 1st or 2nd class depending on length of call back.

<7 days 1st class mail

>8 days 2nd class mail

4s have written software for this to be done automatically, sending dose economailer to specified printer.

After 1 week of pilot the saving equated to £320 which will be £16,640 per year.
